#### ~~~ A Message from the Pastor ~~~

My name is Barabbas. My story is a strange one. You see, I was a prisoner in Israel and was under the sentence of death due to my insurrectionist activities. I awaited the carrying out of my sentence with boldness. I was guilty of the crimes for which I was being punished. My goal was to bring the downfall of the oppressive Roman government, and I was willing to do whatever was required in the attempt. Murder was just one of the many crimes that were necessary to bring about the greater good for which I would give my life. I would gladly die for my cause, and many would come behind me to take up the banner after I was gone from this world. And now it seemed that time would come swiftly.

While pondering thoughts of the afterlife, I was approached without explanation by two guards who silently unchained me from my shackles and roughly escorted me from my cell and deposited me in a back alley in the light of day. Without a word of explanation, I was expelled and thrust back into the world of the living, feeling as a baby might after it is birthed: shocked, confused, exhilarated. As I began to stumble forward, I was drawn by the throng of a great crowd.

To my astonishment, I, Barabbas, was greeted by this crowd. One who had been condemned to die, one who had been labeled a violent terrorist, was now being embraced as some sort of hero. What had changed? What had I done to win the admiration of this people? They would have run from me in fear just a few short days ago. Upsetting the delicate balance they worked so hard to maintain was my life's goal! What did they want with me? One old man, sensing my confusion, turned my face in the direction of a courtyard in which stood the high priest and another condemned prisoner. This prisoner was bloody from torture and clearly exhausted from a long night's trial. What has he done? I asked. He, like you, was stirring up trouble for us with the Roman government. We feared his growing following among the people. But he looks so weak?

Am I expected to believe that this man would lead a revolution, leaving dead bodies in his wake as I was prepared to do? No. In fact, his message was one of love, not hate; of respect for authority, not rebellion. With miracles and wonders he has healed, fed and satisfied the peoples' longing. And for this he is condemned to die? Not for this, but for his claim that his revolution is a spiritual one. And of this new kingdom, he is King!

The crowd's interest in me was short lived, and they were soon riveted on the would-be king, who was now wearing a crown of thorns and a mock regal robe. I shook free of the last grasping hands and walked away in amazement. How could anyone dream of leading a revolution with love? Why would he give his life for such a cause? What difference could that possibly make in this evil world? But the question that lingers and nags at me is this: How could I, Barabbas, a man who was guilty of murder, be set free because he was condemned?





## Session Meeting

What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the March 22, 2022 Session Meeting. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.

The Session of First Presbyterian Church met in the Conference Room at 6:00 pm on Tuesday, March 22<sup>nd</sup>.

- Because the regularly scheduled Session Meeting fell during Spring Break, the meeting was rescheduled for the 22<sup>nd</sup>.
- The meeting was called to order by Moderator, TE Peter Dembroski, with prayer.
- Pastor Peter provided a devotion based on Matthew 5:43-48, "Loving Your Enemies".
- Minutes from the last Stated Session meeting, a Special Session Meeting to examine new members and vital statistics from the last month were reviewed and approved.
- Correspondence was received from the Board of Deacons, outlining new procedures for Memorial Services. Also received was information from Presbytery on the May Presbytery Meeting in Shedd Oregon, and the General Assembly meeting in Detroit Michigan, this coming June
- Consent Calendar items that were approved included the review of the Deacons January Meeting and approval of vacation time for Pastor Peter from April 18<sup>th</sup> through April 26<sup>th</sup>.
- A motion from the January session meeting to amend a proposed revision of the Session's Conflict of Interest Policy and place it under a new section was again discussed. The motion to amend and place the new line, "The spouse or family member of an employee may not serve on the Personnel Committee, Session, or the Pastor Search Committee" was passed and the statement was adopted.
- It was moved and seconded and passed, that "an annual baby shower and meal train for new babies be the responsibility of the Deacons and Congregational Care committee".
- After a discussion of the plans for the upcoming Youth Mission Trip, it was , **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** that session demonstrate their support for the 2022 Summer Youth Mission Trip, so that the youth ministry team can communicate to parents their COVID contingency plans, knowing that the youth trip has the backing of the entire leadership of FPC.
- Session reviewed procedures recommended by the Board of Deacons, which will be followed when the church facility is used for a Memorial Service. It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to postpone a decision on approval until the April Meeting, after further discussion of the procedures.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to have the nomination of church officers added to all future agendas for future Congregational Meetings.

- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to call a Special Session Meeting on March 30, 2022. From 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm, to discuss the Pastor Search Committee, the Church Administrator position, and the structure of Church Leadership.
- Upcoming meetings of the Presbytery and General Assembly were announced and Elders are considering attending. The Clerk of Session was directed to notify all Elders, not just those on Session, that they are also eligible to attend as Commissioners to Presbytery and General Assembly. Those who are interested should contact the Clerk, Dave Dreydoppel for further information.

It was moved, seconded and passed to extend the meeting until 9:30 pm.

Written and verbal ministry team reports were received.

Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, and elders praying for those needs, Moderator Dembroski then adjourned the meeting in prayer.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on April 19, 2022 at 6:00 pm, in the Church Conference Room.

This April in Children's Ministry we look forward serving the families of Fairbanks!




## Egg-stravaganza: April 9, 10am-12pm
