A Word From the Pastor

The 50 Days from Easter to Pentecost are traditionally known as "The Eastertide" in the church calendar. Not counting the Ordinary Days between the season of Pentecost and Advent, Eastertide is the longest season in the church calendar and is focused on celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Of course, we've already done most of the big celebrations. The fancy clothes are back in the closet, the chocolate is marked down at the store, and the eggs have been cracked open and plundered for their candy by eager children.

So, what remains? While the cultural trappings of the Easter celebration may already be set aside, the real celebration is just getting started! As God spoke through the prophets (Isaiah 1:12-17, Micah 6:8), He reminds us that we are always meant to focus on working for justice and righteousness in our own lives and in our communities first. Traditions and parties are meant to encourage us in these practices, but never overtake them. While the feast of Easter may already be behind us, the joyful and world-changing work of Easter is only beginning.

Eastertide is about the impact that Christ's Resurrection had on the men and women who followed Jesus and from them outward to the whole world. What began with a few women and an angel at an empty tomb , with Jesus and a few close friends in an upper room, grew into a movement that captured the hearts of nations and changed the course of human history! This tide continues to flow outward, reaching the distant shores of our world and our hearts. How will you continue the Eastertide? How will you carry the love of God by sharing the good news of the Cross of the Resurrected Jesus Christ? Will you have a neighbor or coworker over for dinner



for the first time? Will you share the story of how Jesus met you in your hardest moments with someone? Will you donate some of your time, money, or skill to a worthy cause that brings justice and righteousness to a broken world?

What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the March 19, 2024 Stated Session Meeting, which began at 6:00 pm in the Church Conference Room. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.

- The Meeting was opened with a Devotion and Prayer
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the agenda as presented.
- Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, Elders prayed for those needs.
- A written financial report was received from the church treasurer.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the Minutes from the last Stated Session meeting, and the vital statistics from the last month.
- The minutes of the Deacons January 23, 2024 meeting were reviewed and approved.
- Session discussed the possibility of providing a second evening meal, during the week, in addition to the Well.
- Session discussed an updated process for storing, sharing, and retrieving Session documents.
- Session discussed a plan for reviewing and updating Church Policies.
- Officer candidate training was discussed, and tentatively scheduled for April 14th and 21st, after Sunday Services.
- Ruling Elders Bill Satterberg and Sarah Albert volunteered to assist with Communion on April 7th.

- The topic of church safety was addressed, with several suggestions made by a member of the congregation. A working group was formed to further address the subject.
- Session received an update, from the Facilities Team, on seating in the Sanctuary. The team is in the process in obtaining samples of available seats.
- Written and verbal reports were received from Ministry Teams.
- The meeting was adjourned with prayer, by the Moderator at 9:17 pm.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on April 16, 2024 at 6:00 pm, in the Church Conference Room.
