

THE WELL

The Book of Matthew gives us Jesus' thoughts and instructions about helping those in need. One of his comments about our obligations and opportunities is, "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat." In other words, serving food to those in need is, at the same time, serving Jesus. At 1st Pres we do that in at least two ways: food box distribution and The Well.

For approximately 20 years The Well has provided a free hot dinner each Wednesday from September through May for everyone who shows up. Besides providing a healthy meal to people who are hungry, it provides fellowship to people who are lonely, prayer support to anyone who wants it, winter clothing for those without. If we had enough volunteers we would love to provide some other helps such as clothes mending, foot care, haircuts, and document reading for those who don't read.

Until COVID showed up it was always a sit-down meal; since COVID it has been take-out. Currently we are trying to determine the format when we start up in September. In part, our decision will be influenced by the COVID situation in Fairbanks. However, it will also be influenced by availability of volunteers. In either format, each Wednesday we will need volunteers for helping with meal preparation (mid-afternoon until 5:45), serving meals (5:45-7:00), cleanup (7:00-8:00). The take-out format requires fewer volunteers, but it also offers many fewer opportunities for ministry and personal outreach. So, we are asking for your input as we consider these options.

What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the July 19, 2022 Stated Session Meeting. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.

The Session of First Presbyterian Church met in the Conference Room at 6:00 pm on Tuesday, July 19th.

The meeting was called to order by Moderator Dembroski.

Moderator Dembroski presented a devotion based on 2 Corinthians 1:3-11, focused on comforting others.

- Candidates for the office of Deacon were examined as to their journey to faith, and their agreement with reformed traditions and EPC Polity. It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to approve the ordination and installation of Janice Cleworth and Melissa Prince for the Office of Deacon, at the morning worship service on July 24, 2022.
- Plans for a new members class were discussed. Pastor Peter will be contacting several individuals who have expressed an interest in membership.

Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, elders prayed for those needs.

- Minutes from the last Stated Session meeting and vital statistics from the last month were reviewed and approved.
- A letter from the Rozell family was received, in which they are seeking support from the Session as they occasionally visit other Fairbanks churches. The intent of these visits is to make connections with the larger church body and to provide encouragement to them. The Session has agreed to approve and support their efforts.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to approve Consent Calendar items, which included the review and approval of the Deacons May 2022 Meeting, and approval of member Susan Freel's request to be removed from the church membership roll.
- A written financial report was received from the church treasurer.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to approve the installation of Kathy Rhamandar Halfhill and Michele Marney, and the ordination and installation of Joe LaMagna, to the office Deacon, at the morning worship service on July 24, 2022, pending their examination that morning.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to elect Ruling Elder Brian Sunderland and Elder Maggie Demers as Commissioners to the upcoming Presbytery Meeting in Gig Harbor, WA on September 30 and October 1, 2022.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to arrange a ZOOM Meeting with Presbytery Officials to clarify issues related to the Pastor Search Process.
- Temporary oversite of recently vacated committee chair positions was discussed. Until new Ruling Elders are elected, ordained and installed, the following Ministry Teams will be overseen by the following current Ruling Elders; Children's Ministry and Youth Ministry: Brian Sunderland, Administration and Personnel: Jim Williams, and Worship: Keith Nore
- Information on becoming a sponsoring agency for a Ukrainian refugee family was brought to Session. The Session has agreed that this is something they would like to explore. The process would require a "Point Person" to organize the project. More information is being gathered and will be presented to the congregation on August 14th at the morning worship service.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to approve 6 days of vacation from August 11th to August 20th for Pastor Peter.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to approve an extension of the contract with Pastor Peter to September 25, 2022.

The meeting was closed with prayer.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on August 23, 2022 at 6:00 pm, in the Church Conference Room.
