

What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the November 17, 2020 Session Meeting. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.



The Session of First Presbyterian Church met, virtually via Zoom at 6:00 pm on Tuesday, November 17th.

The meeting was opened by Ruling Elder Stephanie Rozell prayer and a devotion.

It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to approve the agenda as presented.

Vital Statistics from October 21, 2020 to November 17, 2020, as well as Minutes from the October 20, 2020 Stated Meeting, were received. It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to approve them with one correction to the minutes.

A list of members that were proposed to be moved to the Inactive Members Roll was reviewed. It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to accept the recommendations.

Consent Calendar items were **passed**, with one item having been pulled to discuss separately. The Consent Calendar items included: Approval of the minutes of Deacons Meeting: September 22, 2020.

A list of members who have requested being removed from the rolls of FPC were reviewed, one name was pulled for further review. It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to approve the member's request.

The Personnel Ministry Team brought four motions to the Session for consideration. All four motions were passed.

Personnel Committee: Motion 1: That David McConnell Booher be awarded quarterly bonuses of \$2,500 to acknowledge the high quality of his work and the extra responsibility that he has taken on during the time FPC is without a pastor.

Personnel Committee: Motion 2: That Session approve David McConnell Booher's up-dated job description.

Personnel Committee: Motion 3: That Marta Conner be awarded a raise to her annual salary of \$950 in recognition of her excellent job performance and of her efforts to learn new bookkeeping skills in order to take on increased financial record keeping and processing responsibility for the church.

Personnel Committee: Motion 4: That Paul Bonnell be awarded a raise of \$3/hr from his present pay of \$13/hr to \$16/hr

A written and verbal report on the finances of FPC was presented by the Church Treasurer, Christy Repasky.

A verbal report was received from Transitional Pastor Search Sub-Committee. There are currently two qualified Transitional Pastors interested in serving at FPC.

A verbal report was received from Elder representatives to the Pastor Search Committee. At this time there are three remaining Pastor Search Committee members of the seven elected by the Congregation. There are two candidates who are in the process of being interviewed by the remaining committee members, and elder representatives.

It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to interview one of the two Transitional Pastor candidates. The interview will be conducted by interested Session members and recommendations presented to Session for action.

After the second reading of the 2021 Budget, it was approved with changes made during the meeting. The schedule of elders providing devotions for 2021 was reviewed. January – RE Jim Williams, February – TBD, March – RE Barb Page, April – RE Terry Reichardt, May – Jenna Dreydoppel.

Devotions for the December Session Meeting will be provided by Ruling Elder Mark Lawson.

It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to have the sermon on Sunday 12/22/2020 be presented by the children's pageant and RE Stephanie Rozell.

Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, elders prayed for one another and for First Presbyterian.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on December 15, 2020 at 6:00 pm via Video Conference.
