#### A Word From the Pastor

Advent arrived awkwardly this year. Typically, we begin Advent the Sunday after Thanksgiving and have almost four complete weeks before the Christmas holy day. This year, the calendar got a little wonky and we are simultaneously only a few days into Advent but also almost a third of the way through it. All that is to say that I hope we can take this as a prompt to slow our busy lives down. May you hear Christ's invitation to calm your mind, slow your heart, and listen for His still, small voice that opportunities to see Jesus in the people speaks beneath all of the frantic noise of the around us who are struggling and suffering. world that permeates our lives this time of year.



One way that Christ has been speaking to me in this Advent season is through His word in scripture, specifically through our recent focus on Matthew 5:2-12. As we studied and interpreted these nine Beatitudes, I reflected on how these 9 proclamations of blessings guide and shape us. After nine sermons on this text, if I had to narrow down what Christ is saying to us, a small part of His Church today, it is this: The world will know we are followers of

Jesus by how well we love and bless the poor in spirit, the people in mourning, the meek, the people who hunger and thirst for justice and righteousness, the merciful, the pure in heart, the peacemakers, the persecuted, and the reviled. At some points in our lives, we will find ourselves in some combination of those states. We will need to be loved, we will need to be blessed, we will need to know that God is for us and that God has sent agents of His Kingdom to make that love real for us in the midst of our struggling and suffering. But at all the other points in our lives, we will have Each of those moments will be choices for us to see and love that person just as we see and love Jesus. Each of those moments will be opportunities for the world to see us and, if we are following Jesus deep into His heart for people on the margins of society, they will see a Light so bright that it will reveal the mystery and wonder of Heaven to them in a life changing way.

It is Advent. It is December. It is dark. It is cold. May the Light of Christ shine so brightly in your heart that it drives out all shadows and shivers. May the Light of Christ shine so brightly in how you love neighbors, strangers, and enemies that the whole world cannot help but stare and wonder.



# GREETERS/USHERS NEEDED!





#### WHAT ARE ANGEL GIFTS? WHAT IS THE BLESSING TREE?

We bless people with ANGEL Gifts ALL YEAR LONG.

It is time to think about our First Presbyterian Church Blessing Tree. What is the Blessing Tree? What are Angel Gifts? Who decides who will receive blessings from our congregation in the form of angel gifts? What type of gifts are requested or needed from our church family?



During the season of Advent, the Blessing Tree is a way that our church family members give back and "pay it forward" to those who are struggling in different ways. Your deacons are the ones who organize this project, identify possible recipients each year, and the deacons will make the deliveries to the recipients on or around the 18th of December.

Many families and individuals struggle with paying their electric bill, fuel bill, medical bills, food bill, and providing the basic needs for their families. Our church family tries to assist those in need by making a monetary donation or product donation to contribute to those angel recipients. Each year we have a need for cash donations to support these difficult bills. We also request home baked goods to share with our families and individuals.

We need your help in identifying members of our congregation that may be in need this year. Your suggestion of families or individuals can be made anonymously to the church office by phone call to Marta; by placing the request in the offering plate at the Sunday service; and by contacting one of the deacons, elders, or staff members in person or by phone or email. We would like to have this list of recipients created by the second week of November so we can better prepare our paper "Angels" that will go on the Blessing Trees.

The Blessing Trees will be erected in the Narthex, hopefully the week of November 19th, just outside of the sanctuary, and filled with tiny paper angels that have specific requests of needs printed on them. As congregation members feel moved, they will select "paper angel requests" and then donate the requested needs on each paper angel and bring it to church not later than December 17th. Donations may be dropped off at the church office or given to any deacon, elder, or pastor during the Sunday service.

Angel gifts need to be at First Presbyterian Church not later than December 17th or 18th so that the deacons can prepare each delivery. Thank you to all congregation members and our church family for continuing to support this important outreach mission of First Presbyterian Church.

What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the November 21, 2023 Stated Session Meeting, which began at 6:00 pm in the Church Conference Room. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.

- Moderator McConnell-Booher opened the meeting with prayer and then presented a devotion based on Matthew 5:13.
- A written financial report was received from the church treasurer, Mikki Holt, who was in attendance to answer questions.
- Those in attendance recited the Vision and Mission Statements.
- The agenda was approved as amended, to add approval of a First Friday Event on February 2, 2024 to the Consent Calendar.
- Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, Elders prayed for those needs.
- Minutes from the last Stated Session meeting and vital statistics from the last month were reviewed and approved as presented.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve Consent Calendar item, which included approval of the minutes of the Deacon's September 26, 2023 meeting, approval of a First Friday Event on February 2, 2024, and approval of leave for Pastor David on December 13, 14, 20, and 27, 2023.
- Session continued working on the 2024 Budget.
- The date and location for the upcoming Presbytery Meeting was shared with Session. The meeting will be February 2-3, 2024 at Woodlands Presbyterian Church in Woodlands, WA.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to extend the meeting until 9:30.
- It was decided to put matters related to distribution of the Church Directory on the agenda for the Winter Congregational / Corporation Meeting.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to set the date of the Semi-Annual Congregational and Annual Corporation Meeting for February 11, 2024.
- Ruling Elders Brian Sunderland and Ted Riggs volunteered to assist with serving communion on December 3, 2023.
- The meeting was adjourned with prayer, by the Moderator at 9:37 pm.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on December 19, 2023 at 6:00 pm, in the Church Conference Room.
