### ~~ From the Pastor ~~

February is typically the month that contains some of the church season of Lent. This year, we will not begin Lent until Ash Wednesday on March 5th. But that just means that we have a little more time to talk about, pray about, and prepare for Lent!

Lent is the 40 days (not counting Sundays) before Easter. Since the early days of the Church, it has been a time to prepare new followers of Jesus Christ for the sacrament of Baptism and full participation in the Church. It has also been a time for all Christians to grow deeper in their faith through the disciplines of prayer, fasting, charity, and study of God's Word in scripture.

What a blessed opportunity! What a wonderful invitation to know our Lord and Savior, Jesus better and to hear His voice more clearly!

With all of that in mind, we are planning something special for Lent at FPC this year, and we invite you to join us!

These last couple years have been a season of celebrating all the ways God has built and rebuilt FPC. We have given thanks for our transitional pastors' work, and for all the new growth we have seen under the leadership of our staff (new and old) and our Session. I believe that God is now inviting us into a season of



fasting and prayer as we discern the new vision to which The Lord is calling us. This new vision may be a focus on small groups, neighborhood outreach, advocacy and partnership with a component of our community in great need, or something else God has yet to reveal.

Your pastor, elders, and staff have been praying about this, and while we do not know precisely what this new vision is yet, we do know that Jesus is prompting us to go deeper with Him in anticipation of how God will lead us in the coming season in our congregation.

The Holy Spirit, speaking through Moses and many other Hebrew prophets, called His covenant people to solemn assemblies and declared fasts to discern God's will for them and to grow deeper in relationship with Him [Exodus 12:16, Joel 1:14]. The early church fasted and prayed before identifying their next mission and the Apostles who would pursue that mission [Acts 13:1-3], and as the Apostles identified elders for new churches and how God was calling them to lead [Acts 14:21-23].

Our plan for Lent 2025 at First Presbyterian Church is Prayer, Fasting, and Holy Communion. For the first time in a long time (maybe ever?), we will be celebrating the sacrament of the Lord's Supper every Sunday during Lent. We are not increasing the frequency of Communion as a way to increase our piety, rather, we are doing this to gather together around Christ's table every Sunday and to answer His invitation to know Him better and experience the love and grace of God poured out in a most tangible way.

In addition to this new weekly practice, we will also be publishing a calendar for the season of Lent that includes daily prompts for prayer or fasting. These will include specific passages of scripture and options that allow for modifications for those who are unable to fast in specific ways for whatever reason.

As Presbyterians, we value our freedom in Christ, including the freedom from undue burdens that originate from mere church tradition or human teaching. We look to the primacy of God's Word in scripture when it comes to discerning what is required and essential for salvation and discipleship, as opposed to what might simply be helpful and optional. These Biblical practices that we are taking on for Lent are meant to be an invitation from God for our collective good. Not a new, heavy burden. With that in mind, I encourage you to pray and discern how God is calling you to a Lenten discipline beginning on Ash Wednesday, March 5th.

Lent is not a time for us Christians to feel guilty and sorry for ourselves. Lent is not a time to take on suffering as a grisly pantomime of Christ's suffering on the cross or the suffering of those who struggle with illness, poverty, and disaster around the world today. Lent is an invitation to "Taste and See that The Lord is Good!" [Psalm 34:8]. It is an opportunity to examine our lives and the life of our church, and to plant our roots more deeply in the Living Water which flows from the heart of our God and King. Amen, Come Lord Jesus!

February is here after the eternity that was January. Young Adult ministry is cool because this is a place where we pair zeal with discernment and grow according to how God is leading us as well as being firm with the vision: worship, healing, salvation.

In February we are pausing all 'extra' events and truly doubling down on what God is doing in our midst in the Studio.
