February brings many blessings: a massive increase in sunshine, (typically) warmer weather, and of course, Lent!

Lent sits in an awkward place for many of us. For those of us who didn't grow up with Lent as a tradition, we're still not sure exactly what it's all about. Others in our church family did grow up with it, but maybe only remember it being about fasting and frowning or solemn assemblies.

Put simply, Lent is the 40 days (not counting Sundays) before Easter. It is meant to be a time for Christians to reflect and prepare for the great celebration of Christ's resurrection from the dead at Easter and to grow deeper in our discipleship. Some Christians fast by giving up sweets or caffeine or alcohol. Some Christians take on a spiritual discipline like reading scripture, praying, writing letters to loved ones, or giving to charity. I encourage you to consider how God is calling you to practice Lent.

One way that God is calling FPC this Lenten season is deeper into evangelism: sharing the Good News of what Jesus has done and continues to do in the world and in our lives. One thing that I am asking every household at FPC to do, is to invite a neighbor/coworker/friend from outside the Church (the whole Church, not just FPC!) to join you in a simple act of hospitality and fellowship.

We are kicking off this Lenten Call for our church with a potluck on Sunday, February 22nd that will also feature some board games and an opportunity to learn those games!

If you're unsure about how to go about doing evangelism, try these easy steps:

- 1) Identify the person to whom you feel God is calling you to pray and share your faith.
- 2) Pray for that person every day. It can just be for a couple minutes once a day. Ask God to give you the right opportunity and the right words when the time comes.
- 3) Invite that person. This could be dinner at your house. Lunch at their favorite spot. Coffee or tea at a local cafe. See if there's a quick card game or board game they'd like to play together at this meeting.
- 4) Make it clear that you feel blessed by God to have them in your life. Express gratitude for what their presence in your life brings.
- 5) Ask if there's anything in their life that you can be praying for, or if they have any questions about Christianity, The Bible, or church.
- 6) Don't try to force them to come to church or accept Christ as Lord, simply let them know that you are grateful for their presence in your life and that you are hoping to discuss more than just the weather. If this is an opportunity to go deeper, the Holy Spirit will make it clear.
- 7) Afterward, continue to pray for this person. Patiently wait and see how God works in their life. Follow up with them a week or two later and see if they're interested in meeting again.

I guess what I'm saying is: "Preach the Gospel, Use Board Games if Necessary."

This Lent, God is calling us to know our neighbors, love our neighbors, and share the Gospel with our neighbors. This doesn't mean to hand them tracts, or shout until they repent, or force awkward conversations. It means to extend hospitality to them, to listen to their life, to notice where your life and their life intersect, and to share about how God is at work in both your life and their life. When we do this, God will honor our effort and many seeds of Christ's Gospel will be planted!

Dear First Pres Folks,

This week, I had the pleasure of chatting with a parent who is new to First Presbyterian. I found myself explaining why we create our curriculum as we go, rather than purchasing a perfectly normal curriculum from a reputable Christian publisher. The answer I gave her comes down to: we teach what these particular kids need, at this particular time.

This month, this season before Lent and after Christmas, I look around and the kids are tired. When kids are tired, it can make them jumpy and unfocused and a little frantic at times. To be fair, sometimes tiredness, of the body or mind or soul can do the same to adults. Maybe you've experienced this lately? Observing this, we chose to study the book of Jonah.

We observed that even prophets don't always want to do what God calls them to. We observed that when Jonah tried to run, the Hound of Heaven chased after him, and interrupted his disobedience, and saved his life. We observed that God put Jonah in a time out of sorts, until he could obey.

We spent some time this week practicing stillness with God, as if we were in the belly of a whale.

We practiced drawing close to Him when we don't feel like being kind or generous, or grateful. In this season, with these kids, I hope we are teaching that in difficult times, with all our big feelings, God is present, and He will speak. If we're willing to slow down and rest with Him, He will direct our feet, change the world, and He may even change us.

February

What follows is a short summary of the discussions and actions of the Session, at the January 28, 2026 Stated Session Meeting, which began at 6:05 pm in the Church Conference Room. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.

- The Meeting was opened with a Devotion and Prayer.
- Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, Elders prayed for those needs.
- The vital statistics from December 17th to January 20th and the minutes of the December 16th Stated Session Meeting were reviewed and approved.
- Correspondence was received from our Presbytery and a group of Teaching Elders from the Denomination, with information about an Ad Interim Committee which is at work and will provide its results at General Assembly this Summer.
- The Consent Calendar was presenting and approved; which included approval of membership transfer to FPC for Steve and Julie Hurtle and approval of vacation leave for Pastor David on February 6th and 8th.
- A financial summary was received from Church Treasurer Mikki Holt and Ruling Elder (RE) Paul Reichardt, chair of the Stewardship and Finance Team. For the 2025 Budget, the deficit has increased due to a short-fall in unrealized pledges. Spending for 2025 remained at expected levels.
- Church Treasurer Mikki Holt notified that she would be remaining in the position until August 2026 at the latest.
- Church membership increased by two to 153 as of January 20, 2026. The average weekly church attendance decreased over the last month to 130 per service. Average weekly attendance for 2025 Year-end was 151 per service.
- Director of Children's Ministry Carina Menaker provided possible plans for Vacation Bible School, scheduled for June 7-10, 2026.
- The date of the Semi-Annual Congregational Meeting and Annual Corporation Meeting was set for February 15, 2026, after morning worship. The proposed agenda for the meeting was reviewed and approved. The deadline for Annual Reports to be submitted by Session Chairpersons was set for February 3, 2026.
- The position of Clerk of Session is up for re-election in January of each year. It was moved, seconded and passed to re-elect David Dreydoppel as Clerk of Session for the remainder of 2026.
- RE's David Henry and Paul Reichardt volunteered to assist with communion on February 1, 2026.
- It was passed to approve serving Communion on each Sunday of the upcoming Lenten Season.
- Discussions on the 2026 Budget continued. At this point, the number of pledges remains down from last year, resulting in projected income which will be less than what was expected. Amounts in the budgetary restricted funds were realigned to better reflect the church's financial policy.

- The final version of the 2026 Budget was presented and approved, with an amendment to the overall deficit, lowering to \$-6,385 with the release of \$10,00 in the church plant restricted fund to the General Fund.
- Session determined that Quarterly Financial Reports will be provided to the congregation, in verbal and written formats directly to the congregation, in the bulletin and the newsletter.
- Session was urged to update and review written reports prior to each Session Meeting.
- Pastor David presented plans for a “Board Game Potluck” immediately after morning worship on February 22nd as a kickoff to the Lenten Season.
- Written reports were received from Ministry Teams.
- The meeting was adjourned by the Moderator and RE Brian Rozell led the closing prayer.
- The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on February 17, 2026 at 6:00 pm, in the Church Conference Room.

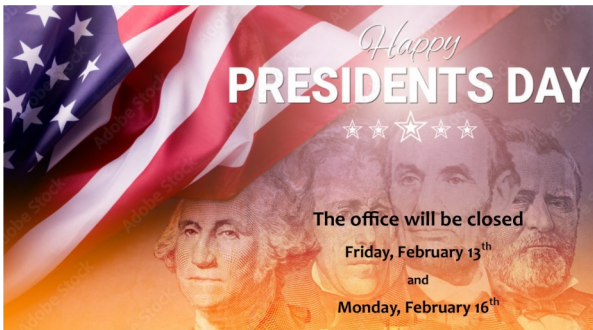
Confirmation classes will review the essentials of faith, especially as reflected in the Apostle's Creed.
