As a holiday, New Year can be a funny thing. For one thing, we have quite a few different "new year" celebrations depending on our own cultural origins, national observances, and religious practices. The first Sunday of Advent marks the new year for the Christian church, the lunar new year in January or February marks the holiday for most east Asian cultures, and the Jewish calendar includes a civil new year celebrated in autumn at Rosh Hashanah and a religious new year in the springtime at Passover.



All that is to say that we humans really seem to like the idea of fresh starts and new beginnings! That makes sense. All too often, we set goals and expectations for ourselves with high hopes, only to be beset with temptation, weakness, and circumstances outside our control that prevent us from reaching these new goals. We yearn for another shot at those goals: a second chance or a fresh start. "Put me back in, coach!" "Let that bell for Round 2 ring!"

God loves to give us second, third, and four hundred and ninety-eth chances! When Simon Peter asked Jesus if we, the followers of the Messiah, should forgive the sin of another seven times (which was the number prescribed in God's Word in the Old Testament), Jesus corrected him: "Not seven times, but seven multiplied by seventy times!" [Matthew 18:22].

This is what our sanctification looks like: 1 step forward and 3 steps back, 4 steps forward and 1 step back. It is why we confess our sins before God every Sunday and confess our sins and seek forgiveness every time we say the Lord's Prayer. We need new years and fresh starts. God knows us, loves us, and is happy to grant them. He asks that we also extend this same grace and mercy to those who hurt and disappoint us.

If you have a New Year's Resolution for 2025, that's great! May God walk with you on the journey of challenging yourself, remaining disciplined, and pursuing a distant goal. But don't get too discouraged when you hit bumps on the road, or fail a step along the way. Remember the abundant grace that God extends to you on a daily basis and show yourself a bit of that same grace. Accept the outstretched hand of Christ, and start along the path once again.
