The Anno Domini (Year of the Lord) and BC (Before Christ) dating system was devised in 525 AD by Dionysius Exiguus (a highly educated Roman monk from Sythia) to enumerate the years in his Easter table. His system was to replace the Diocletian Era that had been used in an old Easter table because he did not wish to continue the memory of a tyrant who persecuted Christians. The Roman emperors liked to rewrite their calendars to begin—year #1—with their own birth. Dionysius set our world's calendars by beginning the numbering with our Savior's birth, and so all nations today number their calendars based on the birth of Jesus, Anno Domini.

News From the Elders

What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the December 17, 2019 Session Meeting. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.

The meeting was opened by Ruling Elder (RE) June Champlin with prayer and a devotion based on Matthew 2:1-12.

Pastor Don presented a "Pastor's Study" on the appearance of Angels to the Shepherds, based on Luke 2:8-18. The Angels spoke and then the shepherds went to find the baby Jesus. "Knowing" leads to "Going" and "Going leads to "Sharing" the Good News. At the January Stated Meeting, the elders present will

practice the sharing of their story, and the Good News of the Gospel.

Consent Calendar items were passed after pulling one item from the list, and included: Approval of Deacons Minutes for October 2019; Rescheduling the February Stated Session Meeting to February 11, 2020; and Approval of a Membership Transfer Request for Darlene Lundberg to Trinity Presbyterian, Wall Lake Iowa. The item pulled from the Consent Calendar was a motion from the Personnel Committee that the version of Personnel Policies submitted to Session be approved.

It was moved, seconded and passed to Postpone until the January Stated Session Meeting, consideration of the Personnel Committee motion that the version of Personnel Policies submitted to Session be approved.

Treasurer Dave Stephenson presented a Financial Report.

Reports from the Ministry Teams were received.

RE Jim Williams moved to Amend the 2019 Budget to include \$1,200 for scholarships for the upcoming Perspectives course. The motion was seconded and passed.

Session worked on scheduling elders to assist with communion each month, for the coming year.

The Senior High Youth will be meeting with Session for lunch on Sunday January 12, 2020 at 1:00 pm.

A Strategic Plan Review of FPC's ministry focus will be held at the January 2020 Stated Meeting.

On January 14, 2020 the Session will have a Special Session Meeting to address the 2020 Budget. It was moved, seconded and passed to amend the purpose of the January 14, 2020 Special Session Meeting to include work on the Ministry Program Inventory.

It was moved, seconded and passed to elect RE's Barb Page and Mike Repasky as Commissioners to the Seventh Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of the Pacific Northwest, in Kent Washington, from January 31 to February 1, 2020.

A proposed set of by-laws for the congregation was distributed to Session. This set of by-laws will supplement the existing FPC Corporate by-laws.

Pastor Don presented an outline of the first sermon series for 2020, based on the Gospel of Luke, entitled "Jesus: The Life-Changing Life". The sermon series begins on January 12, 2020 and lasts until June 28, 2020.

Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, elders prayed for one another and for First Presbyterian.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on January 21, 2020 at 6:00 pm in the Church Conference Room.
