

ELDERS

What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the June 15, 2021 Stated Session Meeting. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.

The Session of First Presbyterian Church met in the church conference room at 6:00 pm on Tuesday, June 15th.

The meeting was called to order by Moderator, TE Peter Dembroski, with prayer.

Moderator Dembroski led a devotion based on Matthew 18:15-20, dealing with conflict.

It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the agenda as presented.

- Vital Statistics from May 19, 2021 to June 15, 2021, as well as Minutes from the May 18, 2021 Stated Session Meeting were received. It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to approve them as presented.
- Correspondence was received from TE Andrew Ekblad, expressing thanks for inviting him to preach, and for FPC's financial support.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to approve the item on the Consent Calendar. The item was: Approval of the minutes of the March 23rd ad April 27th Deacons Meetings.
- A written financial report from Church Treasurer Christy Repasky was received.
- **Postponed Motion**: At the May Session Meeting it was **moved**, and **seconded** to move forward with TE Dembroski's proposal for phase two and phase three of the Transitional Process. It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to postpone the motion to proceed with phase two and three until the June Session Meeting. At the June Session Meeting it was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to continue to postpone action on the motion until Phase One of the Transitional Process is completed.
- Motion on Children's Director Search: It was moved to approve a Search Committee to interview candidates for the Children's Ministry Director position. The committee will include members; Stephanie Rozell and Amber Sunderland from the Children's Committee, Geoff Beyersdorf from Personnel, and Pastor Peter Dembroski, Head of Staff. No action was taken on the motion, which was referred to the Personnel Committee for review and possibly another motion.
- **SWOT Analysis**: The raw data obtained from interviews with members of FPC by TE Dembroski was presented and reviewed. TE Dembroski will continuing the analysis of the data and present it to Session as soon as possible.
- **Agenda for Congregational Meeting**: The agenda for the June 20, 2021 Congregational Meeting, including the Slate of Candidates for Office were reviewed.
- **Date for August Budget Planning Meeting**: Tentative dates for the August Budget Planning meeting were discussed. The Clerk of Session will circulate a poll to members of Session to select a date. Session Ministry Teams presented written and verbal reports.
- **Motion**: The Stewardship and Finance Committee moves that Session receive the Independent Auditor's Report and that the clerk record in the minutes that an audit of our 2020 finances was conducted and received by Session. The **motion** was **seconded** and **passed**.
- Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, elders prayed for one another and for First Presbyterian, and the meeting was adjourned, in prayer by Moderator Dembroski.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on July 20, 2021 at 6:00 pm, in the Church Conference Room.
