## **ELDERS**

What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the June 14, 2022 Stated Session Meeting. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.

The Session of First Presbyterian Church met in the Conference Room at 6:00 pm on Tuesday, June 14<sup>th</sup>.

The meeting was called to order by Moderator Dembroski.

Moderator Dembroski presented a devotion based on 2 Timothy 4:9-18, dealing with relationships with others.

Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, elders prayed for those needs. Minutes from the last Stated Session meeting, two Special Session Meetings and vital statistics from the last month were reviewed and approved.

- The Consent Calendar items were approved, which included the review and approval of the Deacons April 2022 Meeting, and forwarding a letter from a member to the Facilities Committee for action.
- A written and verbal report on the May Presbytery Meeting was presented by Ruling Elder Maggie Demers.
- An update on the upcoming GO Center training, in August, was presented by RE Stephanie Rozell.
- . It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** that Stephanie Rozell will give a sermon on July 31, 2022 introducing the congregation to the Church Revitalization project through the GO Center and encouraging them, as a fellow congregant to be praying for the process and to participate fully in the training and implementation.
- . It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to accept the changes to the Schlofeldt Education Scholarship policy and application process.
- . It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to have a meeting in the month of July with the Chair of the Presbytery Ministerial Committee to clarify some questions on the Pastor Search Process.
- . It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** that the Clerk of Session will make notification of Presbytery and General Assembly meetings three month prior to the date of occurrence, in order to arrange cost effective travel.
- . It was moved, seconded and passed to approve a new contract with Pastor Peter.
- . It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to migrate the church's current IT setup to a cloud based system, and away from the onsite server.

The meeting was closed with prayer.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on July 19, 2022 at 6:00 pm, in the Church Conference Room.
