We already shot past the first weekend of June and I know many FPC families are in full-on "Summer Mode." As you hike, float, camp, travel, and enjoy extra rest at home (hopefully in a hammock!), I would like to share this word of encouragement:

You Were Meant for This

As early as Genesis 1:27-28, we see in God's Word that we are created in the image of God and with a purpose to enjoy God, to steward God's creation, and to live as co-creators under the Lordship of our Creator. God created us to enjoy our work, our rest, and our recreation with our family and friends, in a healthy balance.

It is an act of Christian obedience to take every vacation day that your employer offers you. It is an act of Christian obedience to ensure that you and your family explore some corner of Alaska that you have always wanted to see this summer; backpacking in Denali, floating the Tanana River, driving North past Coldfoot, walking the trail in Creamer's Field, or grabbing a burger from the new spot in North Pole.

As we read more from God's Word in Genesis, we see that the family dynamics of God's people in Canaan (and beyond) are often disrupted and rendered dysfunctional by sin. We resonate with the same hurts that we have endured in families (and in our own personal lives) that are also touched and shaped by sin. But for all of their (and our) dysfunction, the mothers and fathers, and sisters and brothers we meet in Genesis are longing for one thing:

Meaningful time with God and the people they love the most.

Abraham and Sarah want children to love, teach, and raise to enjoy God's blessings and to carry those blessings to their neighbors. Isaac longs to see his sons make peace and care for each other. Joseph longs to see his father and his brothers again.

Here's my prayer and my pastoral instruction for you at the beginning of another Fairbanks Summer: May you get outside with the people God has put in your life. Pray before you go. Look for God's presence as you drive, walk, float, or bike. Try to minimize how much you look at your phone or think about work. Pray when you get home: talk about what you saw, heard, and experienced. Share how God kept you safe or encouraged you when things got difficult. Whether it be a 15 minute walk through the park or a 5-night trek through the wilderness, God will show up. Memories will have been made. The time we spend with God and the people love today will have echoes that ripple through eternity.

What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the May 21, 2024 Stated Session Meeting, which began at 6:00 pm in the Church Conference Room. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.

- The Meeting was opened with a Devotion and Prayer
- Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, Elders prayed for those needs.
- The minutes from the April Stated Session meeting, and the vital statistics from the last month, were approved.
- The minutes of the Deacons March meeting were reviewed and approved.
- A written financial report was received from the church treasurer, who was present to answer questions.
- To Letters to Session were received, one from a church member on the topic of Church Security and one from an EPC Congregation in Texas, asking for assistance with fundraising.
- The Session discussed Church Safety, and recommendations from the recent congregational meeting related to that topic.
- A report on the recent Presbytery Meeting in Wenatchee, WA was presented.
- The Summer Congregational Meeting was set for Sunday, June 2, 2024, after the morning service.
- The Agenda for the Summer Congregational Meeting was reviewed and set.
- Session approved Pastor David serving communion at the Youth Worship Service, on Fridays, on a monthly basis. The worship service had previously been held on Sunday evenings.
- Session approved welcoming Nicole Matthews into full membership at First Presbyterian.
- Session will be examining new officer candidates on June 11th at the Stated Session Meeting.
- Ruling Elders Keith Nore and either Brian Sunderland or Terry Reichardt were volunteered to assist with Communion on June 2nd.
- Written and verbal reports were received from Ministry Teams.
- A motion from the Stewardship & Finance Team was approved, that update the list of approved collection counters.
- A motion from the Facilities Ministry Team was approved, that FPC would ask Next Step Ministries to help with a painting project on June 10th-12th and June 17-19th.
- The meeting was adjourned with prayer, by the Moderator at 9:06 pm.
