

What an excellent witness to the work of the Holy Spirit. God takes our hearts and makes them into something glorious.



EPC DISCOVERY WORKSHOPS Preparatory Work

The purpose of the Friday evening portion is to introduce the ethos of both the EPC with its 5 Core Values and the Presbytery of the Pacific Northwest.

Discovery Workshop: Polity

The purpose of the half-day Polity discussion is to help participants evaluate, understand, and apply the biblical, theological, and historical background and content of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church system of government. The facilitator encourages dialogue and debate concerning (a) EPC form of church government, (b) its support in the Bible, and (c) its application in individual congregations.

Discovery Workshop: Westminster Standards

The purpose of the half-day Westminster Standards discussion is to examine the system of theological thought and conviction that are expressed in the Westminster Standards (Westminster Confession of Faith and Larger and Shorter Catechisms*) with regard to their function and expression in the life of the evangelical Christian community and EPC churches.

Ruling Elders prepare by reading the Westminster Standards.

Ministers and Candidates prepare by reading the Westminster Standards and writing their exceptions, if any, to the Westminster Standards.

We do this through our Mission, which is to welcome all people, equip them for a deep and living faith in Jesus Christ, and send them into the world to share God's love. What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the February 15, 2022 Session Meeting. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record. The Session of First Presbyterian Church met in the Conference Room at 6:00 pm on Tuesday, February 15th.



The meeting was called to order by Moderator, TE Peter Dembroski, with prayer.

Pastor Peter provided a devotion based on John 15:12-17 "Loving One Another".

- Minutes from the last Session meeting, the Congregational meeting and vital statistics from the last month were reviewed and approved.
- The was no Correspondence received or discussed.
- There were no Consent Calendar items..
- Session's discussion about the benefits of hiring a Church Administrator were carried over from the January meeting. The motion from January was amended to read that Session would "**Explore the possibility of hiring a Church Administrator**". The amended motion passed.
- The motion from the January meeting to amend a proposed revision of the Session's Conflict of Interest Policy and place it under a new section was again discussed. It was then **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to continue postponing the vote to amend the main motion until the March meeting.
- It was moved and seconded that "an annual baby shower and meal train for new babies be the responsibility of the Deacons and Congregational Care committee". . It was then moved, seconded and passed to postponed the vote until the March meeting, after having consulted with those committees.
- Ruling Elder Terry Reichardt presented a written report on the activities that occurred at the recent Presbytery Meeting, in Portland Oregon.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to have the "Adult Education Committee look into bringing training by Ambassadors for Reconciliation to Fairbanks for First Presbyterian and the community".
- It was moved, seconded and passed that "Session members will prepare a proposed list of criteria for selecting members of the Pastor Search Committee to the March Session meeting". The Clerk of Session will distribute to session members a draft of a previous list of criteria as a starting point.
- Written and verbal ministry team reports were received.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to extend the meeting until 9:30 pm.
- At the recommendation of the Personnel Committee, it was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** that "Professional Expense policies 309.3, 309.4 and 309.8 through 309.11 be modified to read as presented".
- At the recommendation of the Personnel Committee, it was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** that "Session approve vacation time for Pastor Peter from February 23 through March 2, 2022".
- At the request of the Youth Ministry Team, it was moved, seconded and passed that "the Elders join the youth immediately after church on Sunday, March 6, for 45 minutes to have lunch and meet with the students who would like to become members of the church and/or be baptized".
- Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, and elders praying for those needs, Moderator Dembroski then adjourned the meeting in prayer.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on March 15, 2022 at 6:00 pm, in the Church Conference Room.
