We Are Christ's





I recently encountered a story by Australian pastor and writer John Dickson. After appearing at a public debate between Christian leaders and advocates of atheism, Dickson remembered lamenting that his hard work and thoughtful arguments did not appear to change a single mind or heart toward Christ in the crowd that attended the event. He did his best to "lose well" and to give thanks to God for the opportunity to defend the hope, joy, love, and mission that defines Christianity, even if the event was not a tangible 'victory.' Dickson is an expert in the early history of the church, and he is all too familiar with the ways that the apostles and the earliest saints and martyrs rejoiced in their persecution: their oppression, their imprisonment, and even their pending executions. Paul sang hymns in jail and the martyrs looked for opportunities to encourage fellow believers and show God's love to their captors. Dickson wanted to remind himself and remind us, his contemporary Christian sisters and brothers, that we are a people called to Death and Resurrection. When we experience persecution, failure, or even just discouragement of any kind, we are to follow our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We must resist the urge to lash out in anger the way that the world does; desperate to regain clout or pride. As Christians, we are the Death and Resurrection people. When we lose well, when we are gracious in the face of discouragement or even hatred, the world notices. There is a

peculiar hope in loving enemies and rejoicing in God's goodness even when we aren't experiencing goodness in that particular moment. When we, as Christ's church do this consistently, people don't just notice, they draw close and listen. They want to know where this hope, this enduring strength comes from.

Dickson's story didn't just end with "losing well." One of the professors at the public debate was impressed with Dickson's presentation and character, reached back out to him, and eventually this lead to him being hired to teach early Christian history and theology at a secular university. He was suddenly sharing the truth of the Gospel with hundreds of students who might otherwise have never encountered it! We are Jesus' people. We are called to die with Him and to be raised to new life with Him. This happens in the cosmic and eternal sense, but it also happens in an infinite number of small, daily deaths and resurrections. When we trust God fully through our disappointments and losses, we find resurrection and victory on the other side of them.

We are Christ's Death and Resurrection people.

What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the February 20, 2024 Stated Session Meeting, which began at 6:00 pm in the Church Conference Room. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.

- Moderator McConnell-Booher opened the meeting with prayer and then presented a devotion based on Matthew 14:23, Luke 6:12 & Matthew 6:5-6 on the Practice of Corporate Prayer vs. Solitary Prayer.
- Those in attendance recited the Vision and Mission Statements.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the agenda as presented.
- Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, Elders prayed for those needs.
- A written financial report was received from the church treasurer, Mikki Holt.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the Minutes from the last Stated Session meeting, the recent Congregational Meeting and vital statistics from the last month as amended.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the Consent Calendar item, approval of the Vacation Leave Request for Pastor David, March 10 through 12, 2024.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the final draft of the 2024 Budget.
- Ruling Elders Brian Sunderland and Keith Nore presented a report on the recent Presbytery Meeting.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve membership for Jon & Jess Romaneski and Judy McNinch.
- Session discussed how to more effectively communicate church information to the congregation. Several solutions were presented and are in the process of implementation.
- Ruling Elder Paul Reichardt and Elder Terry Reichardt volunteered to assist with Communion on March 3, 2024 for Sunday morning worship.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve serving Communion at the Maundy Thursday service on March 28, 2024. Ruling Elders Ted Riggs and Keith Nore volunteered to assist with serving Communion.
- Written and verbal reports were received from Ministry Teams.
- Session received an update, from the Facilities Team, on seating in the Sanctuary. The team is in the process in obtaining samples of available seats.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the ongoing service of Communion, by Pastor David, at the evening Youth Service, on the first Sunday of each month.

- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the use of up to \$5500 from the Capital Improvement Restricted Fund to pay for the remodeling of the youth room.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve that the repair and supplies associated with the sewage back-up be paid for out of the Capital Improvement Restricted Fund.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve that both the Children's Ministry Director and the Youth Ministry Director be given church credit cards, linked to the same account that we are currently using.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to continue the meeting until 9:15 pm.
- It was decided that the Session and the Vision Team need to meet together to discuss steps forward with the overall Vision of FPC.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to adjourn the meeting.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer, by the Moderator at 9:19 pm. The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on March 19, 2024 at 6:00 pm, in the Church Conference Room.
