May also brings us to the end of Eastertide, to the celebration of the church's beginning and the arrival of the Holy Spirit upon us, the church, at Pentecost! Pentecost was a powerful reminder that God keeps all of His promises and that we, as the church, are called to not only receive the Holy Spirit, but to use all that God gifts to us through that Holy Spirit to grow the church and bless the world in Jesus' name.

After Pentecost comes the longest season in the church calendar: what is known as "Ordinary Time." This is a seemingly unremarkable name, but it only means that we have an extended season in which to explore the promises and truth found in God's Word that we do not have the opportunity to focus on during the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, or Easter! This is a blessed occasion for us to examine our lives and examine God's Word, and to grow deeper as disciples of Jesus.

This year we will begin by investigating the families we encounter in the book of Genesis. Our sermons this season will be looking at the characters, their relationships with one another and with God, and how the earliest Biblical families and their stories continue to resonate with our families and our stories.

Fairbanks summers are busy for all of us, and I encourage you to keep God at the center of your life, even as your schedule fills up and plans are made. One of the best ways to do that is to continue to meet together with your church family, worshipping God and hearing God's word together.


SESSION MEETING

What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the April 16, 2024 Stated Session Meeting, which began at 6:00pm in the Church Conference Room. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.

- The Meeting was opened with a Devotion and Prayer
- t was moved, seconded and passed to approve the agenda as presented.
- Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, Elders prayed for those needs.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to approve the Minutes from the March Stated Session meeting, and the vital statistics from the last month.
- The minutes of the Deacons February 27, 2024 meeting were reviewed and approved.
- A written financial report was received from the church treasurer. Discussion was held on streamlining the number of Restricted Funds. It was moved, seconded and passed to move all funds from the "SHY Fund" (\$1771.55) into the Youth Mission Trip restricted fund. It was moved, seconded and passed to disperse the remaining \$58.14 in the Staff Appreciation restricted fund.
- The Summer Congregational Meeting was set for Sunday, June 2, 2024, after the morning service.
- The Agenda for the Summer Congregational Meeting was set.
- Volunteers for snacks for upcoming Session Meetings were May: Brian Rozell, June Pastor David, and July: Ted Riggs.
- Because of the scheduling conflict with General Assembly, the June Session Meeting was rescheduled to June 11, 2024.
- Results of a recent meeting of the sub-committee on Church Safety were presented. Several of the
 suggestions presented were shared with Session. These included: identifying those who can assist with
 information and training; Ministries of the church that need to be involved in planning; adding additional
 volunteers to the Narthex Ministry team for a minimum of two per Sunday; presenting an informational
 meeting to the whole church on the topic; and providing a more in depth training for those who feel called to
 provide for the safety of the church.
- The whole church informational meeting on church security has been scheduled for May 5, 2024 after the morning worship service.
- Clerk of Session David Dreydoppel was elected as a Commissioner to the May Presbytery Meeting at Saddlerock EPC in Wenatchee, Washington.

- Ruling Elder Ted Riggs was elected as a Commissioner to the 44th General Assembly Meeting June 18th through 20th, in Memphis, TN.
- Ruling Elders Brian Sunderland and Ted Riggs volunteered to assist with Communion on May 5th.
- Written and verbal reports were received from Ministry Teams.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to grant access to the Session Google Drive to the Church Treasurer, for the purpose of posting monthly financial reports.
- The meeting was adjourned with prayer, by the Moderator at 9:01 pm.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on May 21, 2024 at 6:00pm, in the Church Conference Room.


