

SESSION MEETING

- What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the April 25, 2023 Stated Session Meeting, which began at 6:00 pm in the Church Conference Room. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.
- Moderator Dembroski presented a devotion based on Galatians 5:19-26 and 1 Corinthians 16:13-14. He then opened the meeting with prayer.
- 13 Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be courageous; be strong. 14 Do everything in love.
- (1 Corinthians 16:13-14)
- Those in attendance recited the Vision and Mission Statements.
- The agenda was approved as amended, by moving the Transitional Pastor's report to the end of the meeting.
- Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, elders prayed for those needs.
- A written financial report was received from the church treasurer, Mikki Holt, who was in attendance at the
 meeting to answer any questions.
- Minutes from the last Stated Session meeting and vital statistics from the last month were reviewed and approved as amended.
- There was no correspondence received.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve Consent Calendar item, which included the approval of the Deacons February 28, 2023 Meeting.
- Session discussed methods of streamlining administrative workflow and records sharing. A workshop, to be combined with prospective officer training is being planned for mid-June.
- Session discussed and set the date for the June 2023 Semi-Annual Congregational Meeting, on June 4, 2023 after morning worship.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to reschedule the 2023 May Stated Session Meeting from May 16, 2023 to May 23, 2023.
- In order to formalize the closing out of Pastor Peter's contract, the Personnel Team provided a release from Transitional Ministry Covenant was presented and signed. The document will be sent to the Presbytery by the Clerk of Session to be signed by a Presbytery representative.

- Session received a verbal report from the Vision Team for our GO Center revitalization process. The next combined work session will be Sunday, March 30, 2023.
- Written and verbal Ministry Team Reports were received.
- Since it is easier to start at the beginning of a pay period rather than in the middle, it was moved, seconded and passed to initiate David McConnell-Booher's new financial package on May 16th.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to increase the budgeted amount for ordination expenses to \$9,000.
- The meeting was adjourned with prayer.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on May 23, 2023 at 6:00 pm, in the Church Conference Room.
