Not too long ago, I did some research about the origin of Mother's Day and found that it was started by a woman named Anna M. Jarvis, who first suggested the national observance of an annual day honoring all mothers because she had loved her own mother so dearly. At a memorial service for her mother on May 10, 1908, Ms. Jarvis gave a carnation (her mother's favorite flower) to each person who attended. Within the next few years, the idea of a day to honor mothers gained popularity, and Mother's Day was observed in a number of large cities in the U.S. On May 9, 1914, by an act of Congress, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day. He established the day as a time for "public expression of our love and reverence for mothers of our country."

Not only do I want to commemorate Mother's Day, but I also want to celebrate all women on this special day. In my studies for my dissertation I found out, historical and present-day, stories of women who have experienced terrible sufferings placed on them by their culture. There are appalling stories of women who have been treated as second-class citizens and as property.

But what comforts and encourages me is in God's Word, and church women have been highly valued as equal partners with men in marriage and ministry. In God's word, Jesus reminds us that marriage is male and female, husband-and-wife becoming one in a covenant given to us by God (Matthew 19). In the upcoming sermon series, we have a sermon called "The Holy Spirit" in which we will be focusing on the Book of Acts and we will learn that God our Father and His Son Jesus Christ gave us the Holy Spirit to be poured out on His daughters and sons. I thank God for this.

Snacktime Host: prepare the fuel that keeps kids running all morning and welcome them with fun decorations and friendly faces.


Prayer Warrior: Lift up this outreach with prayers.

What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the April 19, 2022 Stated Session Meeting. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.



The Session of First Presbyterian Church met in the Conference Room at 6:00 pm on Tuesday, April 19th.

- The meeting was called to order by Acting Moderator, RE Stephanie Rozell, with prayer by RE Terry Reichardt.
- RE Rozell provided a devotion based on Acts 1:1-10, "Easter Monday".
- Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, elders prayed for those needs
- Minutes from the last Stated Session meeting and vital statistics from the last month were reviewed and approved.
- Correspondence was received from Pastor Peter, a Thank You Card after Celebrating his birthday at the April 6th Special Session Meeting.
- Consent Calendar items that were approved included the review of the Deacons February Meeting.
- Church Treasurer Christy Repasky was in attendance to provide a review of the new format of the church Financial Report, which was presented.
- The Stewardship and Finance Chair, RE Barb Page presented her report, which included information on the need to update the process involved for awarding the Schlofeldt Educational Scholarship.
- It was **moved** and **seconded** and **passed**, to set up a sub-committee to review the Schlofeldt Scholarship Policy and the application process, and to report recommendations to Session. The sub-committee is to include Youth Director David McConnell-Booher, RE Maggie Demers, and RE Jim Aldrich.
- It was announced that a Special Session Meeting has been called by Presbytery, on May 13, 2022, for the purpose of an update on the PSC Process and an update with Presbytery Moderator.
- Session reviewed procedures recommended by the Board of Deacons, which will be followed when the church facility is used for a Memorial Service. It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to approve the procedures, with a suggestion to add the Clerk of Session as a contact person when requesting participation by an Elder.
- The Clerk of Session was again directed to notify all Elders, not just those on Session, that they are also eligible to attend as Commissioners to Presbytery and General Assembly. Those who are interested should contact the Clerk, Dave Dreydoppel for further information.

- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** that Session Elect RE Jim Aldrich as a Commissioner to General Assembly, which will be meeting in the Detroit area, this coming June.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** that the church's credit card be used to arrange for airfare and lodging, when traveling to EPC Meetings, in order to earn the mileage.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to use the Church's Companion Fare for travel to this General Assembly, if practical.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to call a Congregational Meeting, after services on May 1, 2022 for the purpose of election of Church Officers, Nominating Committee and the Pastor Search Committee.
- An extensive cleaning of the church kitchen was done on the Saturday before Easter. It is requested that all those who use the kitchen, and all the church facilities in general, attempt to keep to a high standard of cleanliness.
- Ruling Elders, Deacons and staff members as reminder to please wear their nametags when attending church services.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to call a Special Session Meeting on Wednesday April 27, 2022, via zoom, to finalize the nominations for the Pastor Search Committee and to elect another Commissioner for General Assembly in June.
- A sub-committee of Session has been researching the possibility of hiring a Church Administrator. Three financial scenarios were presented. Elders will be taking time to prayerfully consider the options, and will bring their thoughts to the May Session Meeting.
- A sub-committee of Session has been researching possible changes to the organization of church leadership, mostly dealing with the size and organization of Session. Further research is in progress and more information will be brought to the May Session Meeting.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to extend the meeting until 9:30 pm.
- Written and verbal ministry team reports were received.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** that Session approve a Silent Auction Fundraiser to be held in the Narthex after worship on two consecutive Sundays in May. This fundraiser will be hosted by the youth and all proceeds will go to the Youth Summer Mission Trip. The Mission Trip Team will be inviting non-FPC members to view and participate in the auction on the Sunday afternoons as well.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** that Session approve a First Friday Paint Night Fundraiser to be held in the Fellowship Hall in May. This will be an event that is open to the public and will be advertised widely across First Friday community pages and other social media.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to due to the high quality of Carina's performance, Session approve a change to her employment from probationary to permanent.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on May 17, 2022 at 6:00 pm, in the Church Conference Room.
