What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the October 19, 2021 Session Meeting. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.

The Session of First Presbyterian Church met via ZOOM at 6:00 pm on Tuesday, October 19th.

- The meeting was called to order by Moderator, TE Peter
- Dembroski, with prayer.
- Pastor Peter provided a devotion based on Matthew 6:24 to 34.
- It was **moved**, **seconded**, and **passed** to move work on the 2022 Budget to the beginning of the meeting.
- Session, led by Ruling Elder Barb Page, went through a line by line review of the second draft of the 2022 Budget.
- Through a process of motions and voting, Session adjusted line items and budget amount for various expenses and ministries, to develop the third draft of the budget, which will be reviewed at the November Session Meeting.
- Vital statistics for the past month and recent session minutes were received and it was **moved**, **seconded**, and **passed**, that they be approved.
- A written financial report was received from Church Treasurer, Christy Repasky.
- Minutes from the August 24, 2021 Deacons Meeting were received and reviewed.
- Due to the length of the discussion on the draft of the 2022 Budget, several motions and items that were to be covered in October were postponed until the November Session Meeting.
- Written ministry team reports were received.
- Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, Moderator Dembroski prayed for the elders and for First Presbyterian, and then adjourned the meeting in prayer.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on November , 2021 at 6:00 pm, in the Church Conference Room.
