Maturing Towards Christ-mas

"By this the love of God was manifested among us, that God has sent his only begotten son into the world so that we might live through him." (1 John 4:9)

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son, so that whoever believes him shall not perish, but have eternal life. For God did not send his son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:16-17)

Last week we hosted our weekly *Family Night* dinner in our home. This group is made up of six international students: three Buddhists, two from Sri Lanka and one from Japan, two Muslims from Iran, a Christian from New Zealand, and Mary, Hannah and me. We have been doing this each week since late September instead of hosting a life group because we want to live intentionally as *Christ lights* on behalf of the world that doesn't yet know Jesus. This is part of what it means to live the kingdom life, or to live eternal life. It is allowing the incarnate Christ to reborn in our lives so that the world might come to know the saving news of God's love.

This, however, doesn't come naturally to most of us. My hope and prayer is that learning to pass on the gospel would be the direction towards which we all are moving. The fact is, however, the longer we are Christians the more we tend to isolate ourselves from those who don't know the Father, Son, and Spirit. The longer we are Christians, the more our social circles tend to narrow and exclude those outside the church. If we're actually growing more like Jesus, however, it ought to be the other way around. We should be growing more missional, more in love with the world that doesn't yet know the Savior, and more in touch with the Father who broke into the world in Jesus that first Christmas.

What has happened in the church to make us turn inward upon ourselves is that we have mistakenly come to associate discipleship or Christian maturity with head knowledge, Bible knowledge, and the practice of good attendance at worship and Sunday school or life group. Now, I will be the first to say that growth in our knowledge of the things of God and faithful attendance in worship, life groups, and teaching opportunities is important, but in our Western thinking, we have come to mistakenly think of this as the whole enchilada of the spiritual life (of course including an active devotionally life). **Christian spiritual growth towards maturity, however, is the process of being formed into the image of Christ for the glory of God and the sake of the world.** If we, as Jesus followers, are not actively engaging the world for whom Christ died, something is terribly wrong. There is disconnect in our faith.

Christ Jesus came bearing the Father's saving love to you and to me personally, and his hope is that his heart, his life, his mission, his passionate love for the world might be *reproduced in and through us*. In other words, Christ came to us, in part so that we might go to others to bring good news of salvation. Nothing is more central to your purpose in life than this, to know God and make him known!

Back to last week at our Family Night. After sharing a meal and casual conversation around the table, we moved into the living room where Hannah drew a diagram describing the good news of salvation offered to all through Jesus. It was so fun and exciting to see the faces of our new friends as they listened and asked questions about this most important news. For them it was the first time anybody had ever explained the gospel of Jesus Christ and we had the privilege of being a part of that. It was Christmas happening all over again. God was taking on flesh and bones through our dinner and conversation to these friends. The love of God was being *manifested* and the lights of understanding were going on.

I tell you this to set an example for you and to encourage you to actively seek ways to engage the world that God loves with the message of the gospel. This is essential to Christian spiritual maturity. In many ways, *Christmas comes every time the Word, who is Jesus, takes on tangible form through our witness.* Will you love the ones who don't yet know the Savior? Show and tell the world that there is a God who loves them and has come into this world to bring them life.

May we all yield ourselves toward being formed into the image of Jesus so that we live for the glory of God and the sake of the world.

Once again, Advent is upon us. Webster's defines advent as "the arrival or emergence of a noble person, thing or event."

The season of Advent is the beginning of what is traditionally the church year— marking time based on events in salvation history centered on the person of our Lord and his church. During Advent we prepare ourselves for his coming- yes celebrating God's incarnation (enfleshment) in the baby Jesus and anticipating his return and the consummation of all history under his Lordship.

My prayer for our particular portion of the Lord's vineyard, for this Advent season- is that we would gain a greater sense of anticipation for God's inbreaking- into our lives, into this community, into history. I'm praying that for myself, and for you!

Did you know, God has a "world-sized" role for every Christian in His global purpose? Whether people go to distant countries or stay at home is a secondary issue. **The primary issue is what most people are hungry to discover: vision to live a life of purpose. Discovering that vision makes this course valuable, and perhaps crucial, for any Christian.**

Perspectives is a fifteen week course designed around four vantage points or "perspectives" — Biblical, Historical, Cultural and Strategic. Each one highlights different aspects of God's global purpose.

The Biblical and Historical sections reveal why our confidence is based on the historic fact of God's relentless work from the dawn of history until this day.

The Cultural and Strategic sections underscore that we are in the midst of a costly, but very "do-able" task, confirming the Biblical and Historical hope.

And friends, for the first time ever, Perspectives on the World Christian Movement is coming to Fairbanks! Thirteen top notch speakers, plus one not so top notch, but I am cheap- will bring their experience, knowledge and insight to our town. The course runs **Jan. 16- May 1**, with a week off for UAF Spring break. We meet Tuesday night from 6-8.30pm at FPC. Childcare is provided. The course costs \$300, the mission committee believes in this course so much though, we've set scholarship money aside for FPC'ers.

There is a registration and orientation class, Tuesday, 09 Jan from 6-7.30, and class begins the next week, 16 January at 6pm.
