

Stewardship is a word that can be a bit fuzzy in our own personal dictionary today. For people who have spent a great deal of time in churches like First Pres, we know that it is often understood as shorthand for "church budget and giving money," though there is more to it than that. For folks outside our church tradition, stewardship is even fuzzier: maybe they think about Denethor from the Lord of the Rings: an old man who has inherited the responsibility of ruling an embattled kingdom but has never enjoyed any of the glory that comes with being true royalty; or maybe they think about stockbrokers who handle millions or billions of dollars in wealth that does not belong to them, but they are trusted with this wealth all the same.

All of these examples are fuzzy parts of the larger reality. The reality is that "The earth is The Lord's, and all that is in it." [Psalm 24:1]. There is no corner of the planets, stars and galaxies, no cell within our own bodies, no area of our life that does not have its origin in God.

Stewardship means living under two fundamental truths:


1) God is the Source of and Sovereign over all of creation.

2) Because of Jesus Christ, we are stewards of this world.

We trust God, and God trusts us. We trust God to abide with us, encourage us, and continue to sanctify us by the Holy Spirit as we seek His will in our lives. God trusts us with His creation, His church, and His resources: the natural world around us, our families, our neighbors, our gifts and talents, even the money in our accounts are entrusted to us by God.

God loves us enough to trust us, and God trusts us to lovingly care for the people, creatures, and things in our lives.

So whether you are filling out your 2025 pledge card for First Presbyterian Church, feeding your pets tonight, or using your gifts to make something new: REJOICE! Rejoice that God loves you enough to trust you, and trusts with the greatest treasures we have in life. How will you cultivate and share such treasure?

Blessings to all of you from your faithful "Sneakin' Deacons!" We bless people with ANGEL Gifts ALL YEAR LONG.

It is time to think about our First Presbyterian Church Blessing Tree. What is the Blessing Tree? What are Angel Gifts? Who decides who will receive blessings from our congregation in the form of angel gifts? What type of gifts are requested or needed from our church family?

During the season of Advent, the Blessing Tree is a way that our church family members give back and "pay it forward" to those who are struggling in different ways. Your deacons are the ones who organize this project, identify possible recipients each year, and the deacons will make the deliveries to the recipients on or around the 18th of December.

Many families and individuals struggle with paying their electric bill, fuel bill, medical bills, food bill, and providing the basic needs for their families. Our church family tries to assist those in need by making a monetary donation or product donation to contribute to those angel recipients. Each year we have a need for cash donations to support these difficult bills. We also request home baked goods to share with our families and individuals.

We need your help in identifying members of our congregation that may be in need this year. Your suggestion of families or individuals can be made anonymously to the church office by phone call to Marta; by placing the request in the offering plate at the Sunday service; and by contacting one of the deacons, elders, or staff members in person or by phone or email. We would like to have this list of recipients created by the second week of November so we can better prepare our paper "Angels" that will go on the Blessing Trees.

The Blessing Trees will be erected in the Narthex, hopefully the week of November 19th, just outside of the sanctuary, and filled with tiny paper angels that have specific requests of needs printed on them. As congregation members feel moved, they will select "paper angel requests" and then donate the requested needs on each paper angel and bring it to church not later than December 17th. Donations may be dropped off at the church office or given to any deacon, elder, or pastor during the Sunday service.

Angel gifts need to be at First Presbyterian Church not later than December 17th or 18th so that the deacons can prepare each delivery.

Thank you to all congregation members and our church family for continuing to support this important outreach mission of First Presbyterian Church.
