HOW CAN YOU TAKE PART?

Our church's 2020 Vision Relay will start on Sunday October 13th. Sometime in that week or two, a fellow member will deliver to you a **SPECIAL GEAR BAG**.

Here is all you need to do:

- 1. Open the Gear Bag and remove the stewardship reading material you will find there. Reflect on the scripturally based message it contains. Then return the printed material to the gear bag.
- 2. Next, remove from the green container the envelope bearing your name. Inside you will find an
 "ESTIMATE OF GIVING CARD". Fill in the amount of tithes and offerings you expect to present to
 God through your church during the coming year. Cut off and keep the stub. Seal the card securely in
 the envelope and place it in the large brown envelope. Return all materials to the gear bag.
- 3. Now and extremely important complete your part of the quest by quickly relaying the gear bag to the next family on the CHECKPOINT LIST. You may want to phone ahead to make sure they are home. Please make every effort to complete your part of the quest within 24 hours of receiving the gear bag....and sooner if possible!

4. After you have delivered the gear bag, immediately call the TEAM HANDLER whose name and phone number are at the top of the checkpoint list. Tell the team handler that you have just completed your part of the relay. (If your team handler does not hear from you within one day, this person will be calling you).

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO PREPARE FOR THIS IMPORTANT ASSIGNMENT?

Between now and the moment you receive the gear bag, reflect on the gratitude you feel toward God for His goodness to you. Become aware of the financial resources He has entrusted to you. And consider the Christian stewardship giving response that is appropriate for you to make at this time. Then in prayer ask:

"LORD, WHAT WOULD YOU HAVE ME DO TO BECOME THE CHRISTIAN STEWARD YOU WANT ME TO BE?"

Then when your Estimate of Giving Card arrives, let your answer that the Lord has given you guide your hand as you write on the card the amount He is calling you to return to Him and invest in His work.

Since coming to Fairbanks, I have done a bit of traveling so when I heard this story it struck a nerve. It seems that on a flight one pastor was on, the plane developed engine trouble. As the plane tossed and turned, the passengers began to panic and, as a stewardess passed by, the pastor reached out and asked her if there was anything he could do to help. In her exasperation she turned to him and said, "You're a minister, do something religious." So the minister took up an offering.

It is not often that we think of "taking up an offering" as particularly religious, yet that is precisely what the Bible says. Did you know that the Bible talks about giving three times more often than it does about praying? The New Testament is particularly saturated with this subject, telling us that when we give we begin to experience the fullness of God's Grace. 2 Corinthians 8:9 tells us that Christ is our example for giving. Extraordinary promises are made to those who give, "*Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over (*Luke 6:38)." *It is more blessed to give than to receive* (Acts 20:35)." *"He who soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully (*2 Cor. 9:6)." "God is not unrighteous to forget your work and labor of love" (Hebrews. 6:10), to mention just a few of them.

Your Session is calling our annual focus on giving "**2020 VISION QUEST**", harnessing the image of Fairbanks' **YUKON QUEST**. I love it! Our giving is a critical part of our "quest" for righteousness, our quest for the fullness of life in Christ. 2020 is our next opportunity to join in First Presbyterian's quest for being a "beacon for Jesus Christ." When you give your money to Christ it stops being money and starts being Love - sick people get well, desperate people get hope, hungry people get food and lost people get saved. How big can you dream? How large is your Love? How clearly do you see the Vision God has for you, First Presbyterian, Fairbanks and this world?

Have you heard of the "Butterfly Effect." The Butterfly Effect is a fundamental part of "Chaos Theory" that is generally defined as "**sensitive dependence on initial conditions"** discovered by Edward Lorenz in 1961.

Basically, this means that very small differences in early conditions give rise to large differences in later stages. Lorenz coined this term because in essence, the flapping of a butterfly's wings in China could alter the weather in the United States a few days later by creating a chain reaction of turbulence in the atmosphere. Tiny changes in one area of the world could affect the weather in another part of the world. Lorenz posed the question, "Could the flap of a butterfly's wings in Singapore affect a hurricane in North Carolina?" Lorenz answered, "Yes!" I would ask, "Could your estimate of giving in 2020 bring the Kingdom of Heaven closer to Fairbanks?" I'd answer, "Yes!"

When the 2020 Vision Quest gear bag comes to your home October 13, do something radically religious...generously fill out the "Estimate of Giving" card and test the promises of the Bible.

What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the September 17, 2019 Session Meeting. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.



- The meeting was opened by Pastor Don, who presented a "Pastor's Study" on preaching the Word. The
 reading of scripture and preaching the Word are always part of worship. Whenever the early church gathered
 to worship, there was preaching. It is the Holy Spirit that prepares the soil, opens our ears and hearts and
 teaches us through the reading and proclamation of the Word.
- The Chairperson of the Pastor Search Committee (PSC) presented a brief report. The Church Information Form (CIF) is almost complete. Several motions were made and passed to edit the Church Information Form. These changes included editing wording, and setting the senior pastor's pension percentage of gross effective salary to 11% to match EPC requirements.
- Session received a financial report from Treasurer Dave Stephenson.
- Reports from the Ministry Teams were received.
- A motion from the Mission, Outreach & Evangelism Team was brought, to amend the 2019 Budget, by increasing support to the Jordan's ministry in Afghanistan, by \$3,000. The motion passed.
- Requests to use storage space in the new closets in the main entry way are to be referred to Ruling Elder Mike Repasky of the Facilities Team.
- A request by Al-Anon for an additional meeting time, on Tuesdays from 4:30 to 6:00 pm was turned over to Ruling Elder Mike Repasky.
- Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, elders prayed for one another and for First Presbyterian.


