Pastoral Message

He was looking right at me. A bull moose that responded to my moose cow call stopped about 65 yards away from me. He came walking up to me shortly after I called him with a cow call. At this time of the year, moose are in the midst of the mating season. A cow call can lure in a full-grown bull moose to a potential partnership and I was able to do this.

I was given a blessing to go on eight-day long moose hunt at a remote cabin. This was my first time away at a moose camp. I have been preparing for this all year with sound instruction, practice and dreams of getting my first moose. I was determined to harvest a moose and especially when after my two hunting mates harvested their own bulls. My plans were to provide meat rations for FPC's wonderful ministry, "The Well", an outreach ministry to feed the poor and homeless. And as you probably found out, I missed the opportunity. This turned out to be the only chance I received that week, but I was very determined to get one and I worked very hard after that missed opportunity at trying to find and hunt "my" moose. I was never able to harvest a bull moose, but God did provide some moose meat for "The Well" from the other two harvested moose.

This failure of fulfilling my long awaited and planned dream could have clouded my whole week at the moose camp. I could have been discouraged, depressed, defeated and overlook all the different ways God blessed me. But instead, God was able to revealed to me all the other blessings that I experienced. There were so many: the rich fellowship of my hunting mates, the gracious goodness of our host, the many encounters of wildlife, the spectacular sunrises and sunsets, the quality times of personal prayer and devotion, the beautiful colors of fall and its transition, etc. God's plan was for me <u>not</u> to get a moose but to enjoy all the other blessings of that time at the moose cabin.

That is why I love the Lord's Prayer that reminds us "thy Kingdom done; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." We can get so fixated on what we believe is what we want that we lose sight of God's grander plan and will for us and overlook the wonderful blessings that are a part of that experience.

How many times in our life have we planned so diligently and earnestly something that we believe on what God wanted in our lives and it turned out to not be God's will or timing? I know many have experienced this frustration and it has caused great depression or feelings of failure. BUT, God is so good at revealing His good and blessed plan to us as we reconsider the situation, release our plans and open our eyes to His grand plans for us. There is great Joy when our hearts are turned away from our failed plans and to consider and receive God's will for us.

I missed the moose but I experienced so many blessings within that experience as I excepted His will for me. Pastor Peter Dembroski

Happy October First Presbyterian Church! Blessings to all of you from your faithful "Sneakin' Deacons!" We bless people with Angel Gifts ALL YEAR LONG. It is time to think about our First Presbyterian Church Angel Tree

What is the Angel Tree? What are Angel Gifts? Who decides who will receive blessings from our congregation in the form of angel gifts? What type of gifts are requested or needed from our church family?

During the season of Advent, the Angel Tree is a way that our church family members give back and "pay it forward" to those who are struggling in different ways. Your deacons are the ones who organize this project, identify possible recipients each year, and the deacons will make the deliveries to the recipients on or around the 20th of December.

Many families and individuals struggle with paying their electric bill, fuel bill, medical bills, food bill, and providing the basic needs for their families. Our church family tries to assist those in need by making a monetary donation or product donation to contribute to those angel recipients. Each year we have a need for cash donations to support these difficult bills. We also request home baked goods to share with our families and individuals.

We need your help in identifying members of our congregation that may be in need this year. Your suggestion of families or individuals can be made anonymously to the church office by phone call to Marta; by placing the request in the offering plate at the Sunday service; and by contacting one of the deacons, elders, or staff members in person or by phone or email. We would like to have this list of recipients created by the second week of November so we can better prepare our paper "Angels."

The Angel Trees will be erected in the Narthex on November 25th, just outside of the sanctuary, and filled with tiny paper angels that have specific requests of needs printed on them. As congregation members feel moved, they will select "paper angel requests" and then donate the requested needs on each paper angel and bring it to church not later than December 19th. Donations may be dropped off at the church office or given to any deacon, elder, or pastor during the Sunday service.

Angel gifts need to be at First Presbyterian Church not later than December 18th or 19th so that the deacons can prepare each delivery.

Thank you to all congregation members and our church family for continuing to support this important outreach mission of First Presbyterian Church.

People gasped and whispered and made faces. He made his way down the aisle and up onto the pulpit. He took off his hat and coat. My heart sank. There stood our preacher. He was the "homeless" man. No one said a word. The preacher took his Bible and laid it on the stand. Folks, I don't think I have to tell you what I am preaching about today.

SESSION NEWS

What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the September 13, 2022 Stated Session Meeting. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record. The Session of First Presbyterian Church met in the Narthex at 6:00 pm on Tuesday, September 13th.

- Moderator Dembroski presented a devotion based on Psalm 23 and opened the meeting with prayer.
- Those in attendance recited the Vision and Mission Statements.
- The agenda was approved as amended.
- Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, elders prayed for those needs.
- Minutes from the last Stated Session meeting and vital statistics from the last month were reviewed and approved.
- A letter from Julie Benson was received, in which she requested that Session release her from membership; a letter was received from Brenna McConnell-Booher with information and questions on the efforts of the previous vision team and planning for the upcoming Vision Teams; and a letter from member Paul Reichardt with information on the upcoming plans for The Well.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve Julie Benson's request to be released from membership.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve Consent Calendar items, which included the review and approval of the Deacons July 2022 Meeting.
- A written financial report was received from the church treasurer.
- A verbal report on progress by the Pastor Search Committee was presented.
- A building use request from Samaritan's Purse was approved.
- Session developed plans and a process to choose the Vision Team for the upcoming GO Center revitalization process. It was moved, seconded and passed to appoint Jim Williams and Stephanie Rozell to form a Vision Team from those candidates identified by Session.
- Session discussed and implemented plans for calling new leaders for FPC. Previous Session members will be asked to present a Minute for Ministry to speak about their experiences.
- Pastor Peter and David McConnell-Booher will be developing plans to create a more welcoming environment for visitors.
- Written and verbal Ministry Team Reports were received.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to extend the contract for Pastor Peter to the last day of December 2022 to allow for planning for Advent and Christmas.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve September 15th and 20th as vacation days for Pastor Peter.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer. The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on October 18, 2022 at 6:00 pm, in the Church Conference Room.
