What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the September 15, 2020 Session Meeting. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.



The Session of First Presbyterian Church met, virtually via Zoom at 6:00 pm on Tuesday, September 15th.

- The meeting was opened by Ruling Elder Keith Nore with a devotion.
- It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the agenda as presented.
- After discussion of the process required, it was moved, seconded and passed to discontinue efforts to hire the proposed candidate for Director of Spiritual Care.
- Minutes from the August 18, 2020 Stated Meeting, and vital statistics from August 19th to September 18th were received and approved.
- Consent Calendar items were passed as presented. The Consent Calendar items included: Approval of the minutes of Deacons Meeting: July 28, 2020 and a motion from the Personnel Ministry Team to approve amendments made to the Personnel Policy.
- Efforts to improve the audio quality of the online services continue.
- Session discussed the schedule for scheduling Pulpit Supply on the Sundays that
 David McConnell-Booher is not preaching. Several elders have volunteered to preach
 and a schedule will be compiled.
- A schedule for Session Devotions was filled out for October (RE Maggie Demers),
 November (RE Stephanie Rozell) and December (RE Mark Lawson).
- Reports from the Ministry Teams were received.
- Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, elders prayed for one another and for First Presbyterian.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be held on October 20, 2020 at 6:00 pm via Video Conference.
