# <u>Quest Speaker</u>



## **First Pres Quest**



For years, I have followed the Iditarod on television and been fascinated by the stamina, endurance, skill and incredible partnership of musher and dogs. Last February, I was snowmobiling down the Chena River when a beautiful dog sled team appeared on the horizon. As the driver passed me, another team showed up, about a mile behind. I learned that these were two of the more than 20 mushers competing in the Yukon Quest, a 1,000 mile dog sled race that finishes here in Fairbanks. How exciting that was!

You have probably heard of the Yukon Quest, but have you heard of the **FPC 2020 Vision Quest Relay (First Pres Quest)**? Yep, there is a new "Quest" in Fairbanks. This QUEST is being held right here at First Presbyterian Church this October. This **FIRST PRES QUEST** is a little different than the Yukon Quest. Instead of a quest for a finish line, it is a quest for a starting line, the start of a new church year of service. It is a quest for the Will of God for us, our families and the First Presbyterian Church. It is a quest for the vision God has given us for the new year that begins January 2020. This quest is also different from the Yukon Quest because instead of needing to qualify to participate (Yukon Quest requires that you successfully compete in a 200 and then a 300 mile dog sled race), everyone can participate. You qualify by participating.

The **FIRST PRES QUEST** will begin on October 13, when "mushers" will leave the First Presbyterian Church and visit 10 "Stations", relaying sled bags from home to home. A sled bag will be brought to your home, in which will be the Vision for First Pres, which we are in Quest of, an Estimate of Giving Card for you to fill out and the address of the next home you are to take the bag to. It is a relay from station to station. The **FIRST PRES QUEST** is a fun, easy and faithful way for each of us to participate in First Pres' quest of God's Will for 2020. You will be hearing more about the **FIRST PRES QUEST** over the next 6 to 8 weeks. Keep your eyes open, parka handy, dogs ready and enjoy the ride!




FPC Women's Association Presents its

## What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the August 20, 2019 Session Meeting. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.

- The meeting was opened by Pastor Don, who presented a "Pastor's Study" on an overview of engaging new attendees into the life of the church. Pastor Don presented methods of "Opening the Front Door" to new folks and "Closing the Back Door" to retain new and current people.
- The Vice-Chairperson of the Pastor Search Committee (PSC) presented a brief report. The Church Information Form (CIF) is almost complete.
- The Session reviewed the latest draft of the CIF, made some suggestions and provided some information that the PSC had requested. The Session reviewed the Senior Pastor Job Description, that is to be included with the CIF. A motion to approve the CIF packet was passed.
- Session received a financial report from Treasurer Dave Stephenson.
- Reports from the Ministry Teams were received.
- Ruling Elder Russ Vander Lugt notified Session that he is being reassigned to another duty station, overseas and in the lower 48. He tendered his resignation from Session. The Session voted to accept his resignation.
- Ruling Elder Dawn Cogan tendered her resignation from Session, as she is attending another church. The Session Voted to accept her resignation.
- Consent Calendar items on the agenda were passed without objection. These items included:
  - •Worship Committee moves approval of guest organist Gail Orcher to play at 1st service and present free concert, Sunday evening, November 10, 2019.
  - •Baptism of James Thurman on August 24, 2019.
  - •Approval of Deacons Minutes for May and June 2019
- A motion from the Stewardship and Finance Team, to approve an updated and amended 2019 budget was passed.
- The upcoming Session Retreat was discussed and a location was determined.

The next Session Meeting will be held on September 17<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm in the Church Conference Room.
