Dear FPC Family,

We had a really exciting time with Dr. Ken Priddy from the GO Center this past weekend. I want to thank all of you who prepared by praying daily and doing the corporate Bible Study on the Great Commission Alignment. Being in the Word and praying are the keystones of our relationship with God. I also want to thank those of you who were able to make it for part or all of the in-person training. We had about 35 people which was great for a fall weekend in Fairbanks.

As we head into fall, we all understand what it means to harvest: we're going out to gather our vegetables, berries, and meats. This year was a bit harder to find the treasure trove of blueberries, but I did see a remarkable number of low bush cranberries and expect that there will be no shortage of harvest out there!

In Matthew 9:35-38, it says:

"And Jesus went out throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them because they were being harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "<u>The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to</u> the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

Dr. Priddy spent the weekend teaching us and encouraging us to take up the baton that Christ passed to us in the Great Commission to <u>be laborers</u> and to <u>make more laborers</u> for his Kingdom. Like the cranberries that we will be gathering, the world is not lacking in the harvest. Everywhere we go, we encounter people who are "harassed and helpless" with disease and afflictions -spiritually, mentally, and physically. In response to seeing them, our hearts should be moved by the same compassion as Jesus to gather them and share the Good News of salvation.

Over the next few months, you'll begin to see our church moving into being more intentional in

outreach. Our goal is not to steal the harvest from other churches, but to seek and find the lost in Fairbanks. We don't have to ask God if this is what he wants - it's very clear that this is the work He calls us to do. He is just waiting for us to join him. It won't always be comfortable. It won't always be easy. But, together, let's picture what it will look like on a Sunday in the near future when we see our church full of new believers who are excited to learn more about Him and deepen their relationship with Him.

As we head into the fall season, there are a lot of things that we can look forward to. If you were living in Pennsylvania, you will be looking forward to the beautiful colors of the leaves changing their colors. This is also true of Fairbanks; the hillsides are filled with beautiful bright-colored leaves. Also, it is the start of college and NFL football. When you connect with a team, you start to see them as a part of your family. They evoke so many emotions in you as you watch them. This is what makes

being a fan. You will experience losses, discouragement, pain and struggles as well as victory, elation, courage and everything in between as you watch them faithfully. In a live game, the fans play a very important part to any team that they are watching. The players strive off of the noise, celebrations and encouragements that come from their fans.

Interestingly, we are given a similar scenario in scripture as Paul encourages the readers of Hebrews that there is a "cloud of witnesses" of heavenly Saints cheering and encouraging those believers that are still living on this earth. These heavenly Christians have lived on earth and have experienced the full scope of life. They have all experienced discouragement, persecution, suffering, and pain as well as love, joy, purpose, peace, hope and faith as disciples of Christ. In modern terms they have "been there, done that."

This passage reminds us that there is a "cloud of heavenly witnesses" cheering and encouraging us on as they wait for the day when we join them in heaven. Knowing that they are cheering for us as we journey through this life can give us strength and courage to live for today as we meditate on this reality.

Several years ago, I experienced in an amazing way what it means to be cheered on by a crowd of 50-55,000 men. As a group from my church participated in the Promise Keepers event at Oakland Stadium, the pastors were asked to come down from the stadium, cross the playing field and onto the podium. As we were coming down, we were showered with high-fives and pats on the back. While we were all standing on the podium, the speaker directed the audience to cheer for us and yell



words of encouragement. It is one of the greatest experiences of encouragement and affirmation that I have ever felt. I continue to look back at that time as incredibly-affirming and powerfully –motivating as I went forward in ministry.

God wants to remind us that every day "a cloud of heavenly witnesses" is cheering us on,

shouting to us to focus our eyes on Jesus as we continue to live our lives moment by moment. This picture should give us strength and encouragement as God helps us to live faithful lives as disciples.

Listen to your Father's voice of encouragement as you read these words from Hebrews; imagine the roar as you are in the Heinz Football Stadium being cheered on by all your loved ones in Heaven... Pastor Peter

1Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. 2Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. SESSION

What follows is a short summary of the decisions and actions of the Session, at the August 16, 2022 Stated Session Meeting. The minutes of the meeting will contain a more complete record.

The Session of First Presbyterian Church met in the Narthex at 6:00 pm on Tuesday, August 16th.

- TE Peter Dembroski was on pre-approved vacation. In his absence, and with his approval, Ruling Elder Jim Williams was Acting Moderator, and the opening prayer was led by David McConnell-Booher.
- Acting Moderator Williams presented a devotion based on Jeremiah 12:1.
- Those in attendance recited the Vision and Mission Statements.
- The agenda was approved as amended.
- Elders spent time in prayer. After making prayer requests known, elders prayed for those needs.
- Minutes from the last Stated Session meeting and vital statistics from the last month were reviewed and approved.
- A letter from Jake and Rebecca Sirevaag was received, in which they requested that Session release them from membership, as they are worshiping with another local church.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to approve Consent Calendar items, which included the review and approval of the Deacons June 2022 Meeting, and approval of members Jake and Rebecca Sirevaag's request to be removed from the church membership roll.
- A written financial report was received from the church treasurer.

- The Finance & Stewardship Elder, RE Barb Page, presented an idea to have Elders take turns including a note in the Newsletter to express their gratitude for the giving and support of the congregation. The Mission, Outreach & Evangelism Team will submit an article for September and Worship for the October Newsletter.
- Session discussed the need to develop strategies to identify and recruit new Ruing Elders, and to present ideas at the September Meeting.
- Five building use requests from community groups were reviewed. Four were approved and one was declined.
- Session members will be meeting with candidates for membership, after the worship service on August 21, 2022.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to approve the extension of the contract with Pastor Peter to the end of October 2022.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to approve 1 day of vacation on September 18th for Pastor Peter.
- It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to amend the 2022 Budget by increasing EPC Meeting Expenses by \$3,000, with funds transferred from the General Fund.
- It was decided that the first draft of the 2023 Budget would be brought to the November Session Meeting for a first reading, and amendments to be made to the budget at the December meeting. To accomplish this deadline, ministry teams should have individual budgets submitted to the Finance Team by October.

It was **moved**, **seconded** and **passed** to move the September Session Meeting to September 19, 2022, the second Tuesday of the month.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer.
